Not sure where your projects best fit? Here's a list of the award categories and descriptions available.

	Categories	Description		
1	Small Residential	Single-family residence with landscaping cost under \$25,000.		
2	Medium Residential	Single-family residence with landscaping cost \$25,001 - \$75,000.		
3	Large Residential	Single-family residence with landscaping cost \$75,001- \$150,000.		
4	Residential Estates	Single-family residence with landscaping cost exceeding \$150,001.		
5	Small Commercial	Any type of building or structure used for business or manufacturing; including apartments, condos, and model homes, with landscaping costs less than \$60,000.		
6	Medium Commercial	Any type of building or structure used for business or manufacturing; including apartments, condos, and model homes, with landscaping costs more than \$60,001-\$150,000.		
7	Large Commercial	Any type of building or structure used for business or manufacturing; including apartments, condos, and model homes, with landscaping costs exceeding \$150,001.		
8	Sustainable Landscape	Water conservation through creative landscaping (Commercial or Landscape Residential).		
9	Hardscape	Creative or best use of construction materials (Concrete, wood, masonry, etc.) Must be constructed by the applicant's company.		
10	Small Residential Maintenance	Landscape maintenance on single family residential property started prior to June 1, 2022, with less than 7,000 SF of total landscape area.		
11	Large Residential Maintenance	Landscape maintenance on single family residential property started prior to June 1, 2022, with more than 7,000 SF of total landscape area.		
12	Small Commercial Maintenance	Landscape maintenance on commercial property started prior to June 1, 2022, with less than 7,000 SF of total landscape area.		
13	Large Commercial Maintenance	Landscape maintenance on commercial property started prior to June 1, 2022, with more than 7,000 SF of total landscape area.		
14	Landscape Lighting	Any landscape lighting project of any size.

Legislation Update: Priority Bills You Need to Know

State Budget Update

The State of California's General Fund budget deficit increased to \$33 billion per Governor Newsom and his Department of Finance. The Legislative Analyst's Office came out and said that the governor's revenue numbers were "plausible but unlikely" and the budget deficit will likely approach \$40 billion for the state. If we go into a recession, the deficit could grow considerably more, perhaps as high as \$50 billion.



Priority Bill Issues

CLCA is currently tracking 118 legislative bills as of June 26th, 2023. On July 14th, the state legislature starts their summer recess and will reconvene August 14th.



SB 220 Corporate Income and Franchise Taxes

California's corporate tax rate is 8.84% under current law. SB 220 would raise rates to 10.99 % – the highest rate in the nation beginning January 1, 2024. The California Chamber of Commerce has designated SB 220 as a "JOB KILLER" bill. CLCA is taking an Oppose 2 position against this bill.



AB 1572 Potable Water Irrigation Restrictions

As currently amended, this bill prohibits the use of potable water to irrigate nonfunctional turf on commercial, industrial, and institutional properties other than a cemetery. The bill would authorize a public water system, city, county, or city and county to enforce these provisions. CLCA is taking an Oppose 2 position against this bill.

AB 1573 Water Conservation: Landscape Design: Model Ordinance

Makes changes to various provisions in the Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance (MWELO). The bill would require the use of at least 75% of local native plants excluding edibles or any area irrigated with recycled water. It would prohibit non-functional turf in nonresidential landscapes after January 1, 2026. CLCA is taking an Oppose 2 position against this bill.
